\*\*How we determined to which students and how much Emergency Financial Aid Grant to award:

Based upon the amount the Department of Education allotted each institution, we used the EFC resulting from completion of the federal financial aid FAFSA for the 2019-20 financial aid award year to determine Emergency Financial Aid Grant eligibility. Students with an EFC of 5,576 or less and eligible for Federal Pell Grant funds were awarded a tier 1 grant; those with an EFC greater than 5,576 or no EFC, but eligible to complete a FAFSA, a tier 2 grant.

Students are advised that by accepting grant funds they agree that they will use these grant funds to offset the costs associated with the disruption of campus operations such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and childcare.
